WASA Delivers on Promise Boosting Supply for Rousillac Hindu School and Community

Rousillac Hindu Primary School and residents of Sultanville, Rousillac are now the beneficiaries of a significantly improved water supply, following the completion of projects to install distribution pipelines to service the community.

Minister in the Ministry of Public Utilities and Member of Parliament for La Brea, the Honourable Clyde Elder, along with acting CEO, Jeevan Joseph and members of the WASA Executive Evolution Team went to both sites today – Friday September 5, 2025, as a follow-up to their first visit on August 9, 2025, when a promise was made to resolve the water issues facing the school, in time for the start of the 2025-2026 academic year.

Minister Elder, while speaking with residents of Sultanville, underscored that it was a promise made and a promise delivered, as he lauded the Authority on the timely completion of the project. He said the works undertaken by WASA in just over three weeks demonstrates the evolution taking place in the organisation, as it works toward delivering quality service to consumers.

The project to benefit the Rousillac Hindu Primary School involved the installation of 300m of 4-inch diameter pipeline along Recreation Ground Road, which also improved the service to 25 residents on the street. In the Sultanville area, 400m of 4-inch diameter pipeline was installed, replacing long service connections and ensuring an enhanced water supply to over 68 residents.

Rajdeo Mohan, Vice Principal of Rousillac Hindu Primary School, congratulated WASA on the improved supply, that will not only benefit the 170-student population but also the residents in the area.

Adaam Sultan, 88, a long-time resident of Sultanville, also commended the Authority on the completion of the promised pipeline works in three weeks, instead of the projected six weeks. He said the WASA team performed well to deliver an improved supply to the community and wished this could be repeated in other places.

Acting CEO Joseph noted that these successful projects underscore WASA's renewed focus on equitable service. He pledged that the Executive Evolution Team would continue its national tour, using these findings to prioritise upgrades in the most underserved communities.
