

WASA MANAGING WATER SUPPLY ACROSS NORTH EAST TRINIDAD AS HOLLIS RESERVOIR CONTINUES TO RECHARGE

Friday 17th July 2026: The Water and Sewerage Authority (WASA) is actively managing the distribution of available water supplies as the Hollis Reservoir continues its gradual recharge.

Inflows into the reservoir have improved but remain below the levels needed to fully restore normal production. WASA is monitoring reservoir levels around the clock and adjusting operations daily to maximise production and share the available supply as fairly as possible across all affected communities. Some customers may continue to experience reduced pipe-borne supply or revised service schedules while this work continues.
